## SECTION 3: PARTICIPANT RULES & CODE OF CONDUCT

### Eligibility Requirements

#### All participants must:

- Be current AAU members (enroll at [ausports.org/membership](https://ausports.org/membership) and allow 10 days for membership to process)
- Be in good standing with AAU
- Provide age and belt rank
- Follow all AAU Taekwondo competition rules
- Comply with this tournament's code of conduct

#### Athletes under 18:

- Must have a parent/guardian signature on the liability waiver (see registration)
- Parent/guardian must be present at tournament
- Must wear appropriate protective equipment

### Participant Code of Conduct

All athletes, coaches, parents, and spectators are expected to conduct themselves with respect, integrity, and sportsmanship.

## Consequences for Code of Conduct Violations

1. **First Violation:** Verbal warning
2. **Second Violation:** Written warning; may be removed from current event
3. **Third Violation:** Disqualification from tournament; possible ban from future AAU events
4. **Severe Violations:** Immediate disqualification and possible ban

**Severe violations include:** Physical violence, threats, harassment, or actions that endanger others

## Para Athletes & Parent/Guardian Support

**Para and Special Needs athletes** are athletes with physical, intellectual, or sensory disabilities who meet current AAU Para Taekwondo and Special Needs eligibility and classification guidelines for their chosen event. (Reference AAU Handbook for Divisions Rules)

- Para/Special Needs divisions at this event are **AAU-recognized qualifying divisions** for AAU National Championships and AAU Junior Olympic Games
- Each para athlete may have **one designated parent/guardian assistant support** listed at registration
- Assistant Support must be a **legal adult**, in good standing with AAU, and must **check in at registration** on tournament day

- **No additional fee** for support assistants
- Assistant support duties may include guidance, mobility support, communication, sensory support, etc., as long as this does not interfere with officials, other competitors, or AAU scoring rules
- Assistant support have **floor access only while their athlete is staging or actively competing**
- All Assistant support must follow tournament code of conduct and AAU Taekwondo rules

## SECTION 4: SPECTATOR POLICIES

### Spectator General Rules

- Spectators are welcome; pre-purchase and at-door tickets available (see Section 2)
- Children 5 and under admitted FREE
- Spectators must adhere to code of conduct

### Floor Restrictions (IMPORTANT)

**NO spectators are allowed on the competition floor at any time.**

- Only athletes competing in their scheduled event may be on the floor or in staging
- Only coaches for that specific division may be on the floor or in staging
- Parents and spectators must watch from designated seating areas

Athletes who require disability-related accommodations or who are registering for Para divisions should ensure this is indicated at registration so that any allowable modifications can be applied consistent with the Para Taekwondo provisions in the AAU Taekwondo Handbook.

- **Weight Classes:** Vary by age group (determined at check-in) (reference AAU Handbook)
- **Male & Female Divisions:** All age groups, belt levels, and weight classes separated by gender
- **AAU National Qualification:** All standard and Para/Special Needs divisions at this tournament are AAU-licensed qualifying divisions. Eligible athletes who place within AAU-designated qualifying positions will qualify for AAU National Championships and/or AAU Junior Olympic Games
